- PubMed
  - Add firefox search engine directly while on site
  - Limits on search
    - specific journals
    - specific languages
    - types of clinical studies
  - "Send to RSS feed"
- HubMed
  - Add Firefox search engine directly while on site
  - Main features listed on front page
    - Export to various ref managers
    - Citation Finder - awesome for dereferencing papers
    - View related papers, including with TouchGraph, great for exploring
    - Graph occurrences of keywords over time
      - Examples
        - Cardiac Resynchronization Therapy
        - PCR (polymerase chain reaction)
        - HIV (keep on-screen for next step)
  - Search Features
    - Cluster results (from HIV - select a cluster)
    - Clip (clip some, go to clipboard)
    - Related (load graph, list in separate tabs)
    - Export (export from bottom of page of clippings)
    - Feeds (search for something, show RSS icon)
- Cite-U-Like
  - Search already added papers
  - Post (normally with browser button)
    - Sources
      - Usually from pubmed
      - Also from major publisher sites
      - Some journals
      - Amazon.com!
      - Manually
    - Things to note when posting
      - Tags
        - I suggest just tagging by project
        - Subject not really important for most people
        - Priority very natural!
    - After posting
      - Add a PDF
  - Once you have a library
    - Authors and Tags
